INTRODUCTION

AWiA (African Women in Agriculture) was started by women in response to the gap in access to agricultural knowledge, tools and resources for women, and to date we have implemented various agricultural

entrepreneurial capacity development programs and an incubator. AWiA's agricultural incubator was launched in February, 2021, and it promotes entrepreneurship, reduces the risk of food security, provides agricultural training and support to socially disadvantaged female aspiring entrepreneurs.



Increased agricultural activity is key to achieving progress towards poverty reduction, particularly in certain areas of South Africa where the link between poverty and hunger is most acute. AWiA implements initiatives that make efficient use of available resources and builds capacity in the disenfranchised.

African Women in Agriculture (AWiA) is reimagining agriculture for women.

An agricultural incubator was developed as our flagship program, with the intention of empowering agri-preneurs with agribusiness skills and tools, resulting in economic development. AWiA seeks to mitigate avoidable risks in agricultural and agri-business start-ups formed by female agripreneurs, thereby increasing their rate of success and decreasing the time it takes for their businesses to gain traction. AWiA also seeks to present an enabling environment within which women in agriculture can thrive.

To date AWiA has trained over 300 women and 25 men.
